

# Phone/App/Game/Internet Safety for Kids

## Parental Controls

- I Phone and Android have some built in parental controls, but most **aren't adequate** to protect children. While nothing is fool-proof, app blockers and parental controls are the **first step** in internet safety.
- Most **free controls are not adequate**. Plan to spend money to have controls that actually filter things well.

**Popular Games** that parents should pay attention to before giving unmonitored access; ages indicate minimum for who the game is intended for:

- **Minecraft**: creepy characters, links to sex trafficking (14 years old and has no blocks)
- **Call of Duty**: sexualized content, violence, chat rooms (18 years old and is very open)
- **Fortnite**: adult undertones, dances (13 years old)
- **Roblox** (11 years old; has some blocks)
- **APEX Legends**
- **Plants vs. Zombies**

**Limit Access and/or Block content:** Many things available on the internet have **13 years old** as the youngest age to sign up. Many parents allow their children of younger ages to lie about their age to get access. Be careful of this practice!!

## Advice for Parents from Tim Watson, Child Safety Officer for World Venture, (CSPN Conference 2021)

- School Devices: Don’t assume these have adequate filters (Christian/MK schools, too)
- Sexting usually begins in middle school (11 to 12 years old)
- Minecraft, Roblox and Fortnite are open groups, so there is a greater chance of online predators/grooming for abuse
- Pornography that kids may be seeing is much more violent than in years past (much of it contains violence against women); as a result many perpetrators of sexual abuse against children are males aged 11 to 15
- Consider waiting until 8th grade or older for kids to have personal phones
- Phones and internet access are a part of our kids’ lives. The answer is not to just take devices away. The goal is to equip kids and empower them to stay safe while online.
